Initiative objectives

- Leveraging electronic resources to retrieve information (e.g., prior art, search reports, etc.) from relevant sources (e.g., related U.S. applications, counterpart foreign and PCT applications)
- Automatically import information into the file wrapper of a U.S. patent application under examination at the earliest point
 - Potentially reduce applicant's burden under the duty of disclosure.

Application Case Studies

 400+ cases reviewed to consider the effects of importing prior art on prosecution and examiners



Access to Relevant Prior Art: Phase 1

- Began November 1, 2018
- Initial implementation is a targeted release and will not be a corps-wide release
 - November 1: Released to Art Unit 2131
 - January 1: Released to Art Units 1616, 1731, 2431, 2675, 2879, 2922, 3635, and 3753
- Subsequent phases of the project will consider importing from additional sources, such as counterpart foreign and PCT applications.



Access to Relevant Prior Art: Phase 1

- Automatically imports citations from immediate U.S. parent applications into certain pending continuing U.S. applications for consideration by the examiner.
- Imported citations will be printed on the face of any patent that issues from the continuing application with a new indicator.
- This collection of imported citations is called the Master Reference List (MRL).



Citations in the MRL

- All citations on all Information Disclosure Statements (IDSs) (e.g. SB/08) and PTO-892s in the immediate parent application at the time of importation
- All citations on any IDS in the child application at the time of importation
- Note: IDSs and PTO-892s filed in parent and IDSs filed in the child application after importation will not be in the MRL in the initial release.
- Importation will occur once, after pre-exam but prior to docketing to the Examiner.



Notice of Imported Citations (NIC)

- Informs the applicant that the application has been entered into the RPA Initiative
- Lists all citations that have been imported from the parent application
- Applicant does not need to respond to the NIC
- The presence of an NIC in an RPA application indicates that the application is ready to be examined

Examiner consideration

- In the MRL, examiners must consider all documents imported from the parent unless they were not compliant with 37 CFR 1.98 in the parent (e.g. no copy filed).
- Examiners may use the MRL to consider documents cited on IDSs in the child application.
- Information in the MRL will be considered to the same extent as information submitted by the applicant on an IDS (see MPEP 609.05(b)).
- If a translation or explanation of relevance is not available, the examiner should go to the parent application to view it.



Indication of examiner consideration

Citations Imported from Parent

- Indicate whether a document is considered or not considered in the RPA viewer.
- Indicate in the office action the reason(s) a citation was not considered.
- Generate Notice of Consideration and mail with the next office action.

Citations from IDSs in instant application

Follow normal IDS procedure.



Notice of consideration

- Form is auto-generated based upon the consideration indications in the RPA viewer.
- Citations indicated as not considered will be displayed on the form with a strike-through.
- Signature and date are auto-populated.
- Mail with the next office action.
