## **USPTO Patent Pro Bono Program**


Nationwide network that assists financially underresourced independent inventors and small businesses

  - Pay USPTO filing fees and costs
  - Demonstrate knowledge of the patent system

  - Have application prescreened to ensure that there is more than an idea
