

DOC40PAPT 1202101 – Software Licenses – Unisys - The United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) intends to award a sole source purchase order to Unisys Corporation, Unisys Way, Blue Bell, PA, 19424 in the amount of \$1.3 million for additional software licenses for the Unisys ClearPath Plus Libra Model 595 and Model 585 servers which the USPTO owns and operates. Unisys software licenses are term licenses and the additional software licenses are required in order to continue operating the servers beyond the point where the current licenses are exhausted. The USPTO owns two Unisys ClearPath Plus Libra computer servers in operation. Currently, the USPTO has over 1,000 programs developed over the last 28 years, which will only run on Unisys ClearPath Libra Plus computers. Among the 1,000 programs currently being run on Unisys Clear Path Libra Plus computers, the principle application being run on these computers is Trademark Reporting and Monitoring System (TRAM) for Trademarks. There is only one source from which additional licenses can be purchased. Unisys does not have any authorized resellers or dealers from which the USPTO can purchase the additional licenses. A recompetition of the product at this time would require a costly conversion effort of the applications that run on these servers. The USPTO intends to award a purchase order, utilizing Part 13 of the FAR, Simplified Acquisition procedures, and the test program authorized in FAR subpart 13.5, and the Patent and Trademark Acquisition Guidelines (PTAG). In accordance with the PTAG and FAR 6.302-1, 10.U.S.C 2304 (c)(1) or 41 U.S.C. 253(c)(1), Unisys is the only one responsible source and no other supplies or services will satisfy agency requirements. No solicitation will be issued as a result. Unisys is the hardware and software developer, and is the only source for the proprietary software licenses for the Unisys ClearPath Plus Libra Model 595 and Model 585 servers.
