This is a decision on the petition captioned, "PETITION TO THE DIRECTOR PURSUANT TO 37 C.F.R. § 1.181," filed on July 14, 2012, requesting that the Director review the Decision on Application for Reconsideration of Patent Term Adjustment mailed on May 14, 2012. This is also treated as a request for reconsideration that the patent term adjustment indicated on the face of the Letters of Patent be corrected from zero (0) days to five hundred twenty-four (524) days (or, in the alternative, thirty-five (35) days).

The petition for supervisory review by the Director is a request for reconsideration and as such both petitions are treated by this decision. The request for review and reconsideration are granted to the extent that the decision has been reconsidered. No error having been found in the previous decision, however, both are **DENIED** with respect to making any change in the patent adjustment determination under 35 U.S.C. 154(b) of 0 days. This decision may be viewed as a final agency action within the meaning of 5 U.S.C. 704 and for purposes of seeking judicial review. See MPEP 1002.02.

The Office acknowledges the previous submission of the \$200.00 fee set forth in 37 CFR 1.18(e). As this request pertains only to the over 3-year delay issue previously raised in the application for patent term adjustment, no additional fees are required.

The patent term adjustment remains 0 days, as indicated in the decision mailed on May 14, 2012.
