



Elements of Theft of Trade Secrets (18 U.S.C. § 1832)

- Intent to convert TS to economic benefit of person who is not owner;
- ► TS related to product/service in interstate/foreign commerce;
- Intent/knowledge that TS owner would be injured;
- Δ knowingly:
 - [stole] [appropriated] [took] [carried away] [concealed] [obtained by fraud] [obtained by artifice] [obtained by deception] TS;
 - [copied] [duplicated] [sketched] [drew] [photographed] [downloaded] [uploaded] [altered] [destroyed] [photocopied] [replicated] [transmitted] [delivered] [sent] [mailed] [communicated] [conveyed] TS; or
 - [received] [bought] [possessed] TS, knowing TS was [stolen] [appropriated without authorization] [obtained without authorization] [converted without authorization].

Economic Espionage (18 U.S.C. § 1831)

Intent/knowledge that actions would benefit foreign government

Charges

November 2015: Third Superseding Indictment

▶ 9 counts of violating 18 U.S.C. § 1832(a)

- Unauthorized Possession of TSs
- Attempted Possession of TSs
- ► 5 of ev3's TSs; 4 of Edwards' TSs

Sentencing

- Pleaded guilty to 6 counts of Theft of Trade Secrets and Attempted Theft of Trade Secrets
- Agreed to forfeit/assign foreign & domestic patents
- January 2019: 27 months' imprisonment
