Dan Hunter is the Director for International Work Sharing, Planning and Implementation in the Office of International Patent Cooperation where he is the lead for all work sharing efforts and responsible for the Collaboration Search Pilot (CSP) Program, Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH), the PCT Collaborative Search and Examination project and other international work sharing efforts.

Mr. Hunter joined the USPTO in 1993 as a patent examiner in the telephony art, and later becoming a Supervisory Patent Examiner in wireless communications in 1999. Mr. Hunter has been designated as a subject matter expert on patent operations and patent data and served as a senior advisor in the Office for the Commissioner of Patents focusing on issues associated with patent prosecution and improving the patent examination processes. Mr. Hunter is the business architect for the Patent organization and is responsible for developing and maintaining the activities of the Patent Activity Based Information (ABI) cost model.

Mr. Hunter graduated from Penn State in 1982 with a Bachelors of Science in Engineering Science. Following graduation, he was commissioned in the US Navy and taught at the Naval Nuclear Power School. Following a tour on the aircraft carrier USS America, he attended graduate school at the Naval Postgraduate School and received his Masters of Science in Electrical Engineering (Space Systems Engineering) in 1990.
