#### I. Introduction

On November 7, 2019, we granted Precedential Opinion Panel review in this proceeding. Paper 46 ("Order"). In our Order, we asked the parties to address whether an oral argument was necessary. *Id.* at 2. Both parties indicated that oral argument would assist the panel in addressing the issues on which review was granted. Paper 49, 1; Paper 51, 14. We have determined that the issues presented would benefit from an oral argument, and, accordingly, we grant the parties' requests.

### II. Oral Argument

The oral argument for this proceeding will be conducted on **February 18, 2020**, beginning at **1:15 PM Eastern Time**, on the ninth floor of Madison Building East, 600 Dulany Street, Alexandria, Virginia. Each party will have 15 minutes of total argument time.

Patent Owner will proceed first to present its arguments, and may reserve up to five (5) minutes for rebuttal. Thereafter, Petitioner will respond. Afterwards, Patent Owner may make use of its reserved rebuttal time.

The hearing room will be open to the public for in-person attendance. Attendance will be accommodated on a first come, first served basis.

The Board will provide a court reporter for the argument, and the reporter's transcript will constitute the official record of the hearing.

The Board expects lead counsel for each party to be present in person at the oral argument. However, lead or backup counsel may present the party's argument.
