Amber Ostrup is a Program Manager for the Office of International Patent Cooperation (OIPC), International Work Sharing, Planning and Implementation Division. Ms. Ostrup is responsible for coordinating work sharing efforts amongst the five largest intellectual property offices; European Patent Office (EPO), Japan Patent Office (JPO), Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO), State Intellectual Property Office of the People's Republic of China (SIPO), and United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO), also known as the IP5. Ms. Ostrup works closely with patent executives, patent operation managers and labor unions on international efforts, including, work sharing pilot programs and training of examiners.

Ms. Ostrup has been instrumental in the development of numerous highly effective programs including the establishment of the USPTO Ombudsman Program; automating the Patent Hiring Center; and most recently, establishment of the OIPC.
