Credit submitters down to the person(s) not just the crowdsourcing company when examiners apply their reference in an office action or list it in an Information Disclosure Statement. And not just by attaching the submitters name and art to the application, but informing the submitter of their art's use. The crowdsourcing company as well as the USPTO can also offer the submitter additional compensation based on how their reference is treated in prosecution or some other aspect of the case.
