Relocation of Customer Service Window for Patent-Related Correspondence

On April 29, 2024, the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) announced via a Patent Alert that it was relocating the Patent Customer Service Window at its Alexandria headquarters. On April 30, 2024, the Customer Service Window for patent-related correspondence moved to the Knox Building, which is adjacent to the Randolph Building. The Manual of Patent Examining Procedure (MPEP) will be updated in due course.

The new Customer Service Window began receiving hand-carried or delivered documents at the above Knox Building address on April 30, 2024. The hours of operation at the new location are 8:30 a.m. to 11:59 p.m. ET, Monday through Friday, except on federal holidays and when the USPTO is closed for inclement weather or an emergency. No application numbers will be assigned by window staff at the time of delivery.
