Dear USPTO,

The amount of chaos, disruption and uncertainty unleashed by the AIA and its implementation has caused literally billions of dollars of economic and financial damage to individuals' lives, corporations' business operations as well as entire industries' efforts to invent a better future for the United States. Fortunately, the 2019 Revised Patent Subject Matter Eligibility Guidance will help correct some of the issues which have come about as a result of this ill-conceived law. I write in support of the proposed guidance's enactment.
