## How to avoid scams

- Verify <u>USPTO employee contact information</u> when in doubt, request to call back anyone identifying themselves as a USPTO employee.

- Verify your attorney's identity by contacting your local state bar association.
- Verify the authenticity of any USPTO correspondence by contacting your attorney, or the Trademark Assistance Center.

## What to do if you get fooled

- Report financial scams to your bank.
- Submit a fraud complaint to the <u>Federal Trade Commission</u> (FTC).
- Contact your local Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) field office.
- Contact your local attorney general.
- Report phone scams to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).
