This is a decision on the "PETITION UNDER 37 C.F.R. § 1.181(a)(3) TO INVOKE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY OF THE DIRECTOR," filed June 27, 2012. Patentees request that the patent term adjustment indicated on the face of the Letters of Patent be corrected from three hundred and twenty-seven (327) days to four hundred and fifty-one (451) days.


On December 27, 2011, the above-identified application matured into US Patent No. 8,086,253 with a patent term adjustment of 325 days. An original request for reconsideration of patent term adjustment was timely filed on February 23, 2012, within two months of the issue date of the patent. See 37 C.F.R. § 1.705(d). By decision mailed March 13, 2012, the request for reconsideration was granted to the extent that the decision indicated that Patentees are entitled to a patent term adjustment of 327 days.

On April 13, 2012, a second request for reconsideration was filed, and was denied via the mailing of a decision on April 27, 2012.

In a final agency action, within the meaning of 35 U.S.C. § 704, mailed April 27, 2012, the petition under 37 C.F.R. § 1.705(d) and the included request to correct the patent term adjustment indicated on the face of the Letters of Patent from three hundred and twenty-seven (327) days to four hundred and fifty-one (451) days was **DENIED**. It was concluded for reasons set forth in the decision that the patent term adjustment indicated

on the face of the Letters of Patent will not be changed, other than the issuance of a Certificate of Correction indicating the patent term adjustment is 327 days.

There will be no further consideration of the patent term adjustment indicated on the face of the Letters of Patent by the Office.
