Subject: 4 Corners Approach

While I am well aware of the restrictions on number of future offices available at this point, I think the following should be considered:

A "corners" approach wherein offices are placed in (a) the Southeast USA (Atlanta), (b) Texas (DFW or Houston), (c) California (Los Angeles or San Francisco).

This would place the offices in a "plus-sign," admittedly not in the exact corners of the USA, but in thriving locations with convenient access.

Alternatively, the Offices may be put in other economically depressed cities to reinvigorate their markets - as was done with Detroit. Other examples might include Memphis, TN or Birmingham, Alabama. These locations, much like Detroit, would greatly benefit from an infusion of jobs for intelligent, educated people.

As I now live in Tennessee, I think Nashville, as well as the majority of Southeast states, merits attention from the Office: there are arguably more automotive sector jobs here than in Toledo/Detroit. Consider Nissan manufacturing and *headquarters*, Toyota and BMW to name only a few. With "foreign" manufacturers finding it appropriate to invest in the Southeast, the USPTO should do the same.
