

View line Procedure for Checker Report

Using Microsoft "Word" to View Line Numbers and Set Margins in a Sequence Listing

A Microsoft Word macro can be used to quickly add line numbers to a sequence listing for locating errors identified by the Checker application. Microsoft Word 97 or later is required. To install the Visual Basic macros, the user must import the file "CrfMacros.bas" into Word's Normal.dot template using the procedures provided with this distribution. A complete set of instructions ("CrfMacros.doc"), and the necessary Visual Basic macro files, are included with the Checker download. Both of these files will be copied into your Checker installation directory by the Checker Setup application.

Procedure for setting Microsoft Word as the default Checker editor:

Start the application, i.e. CRF3.exe or Checker.exe, press Continue to enter the menu dialog box.

1. From the main menu bar, select File - Administration - Properties to display default paths.
2. The Editor Directory path should be set to use Write.exe, i.e. WordPad as default.
3. Select "Normal" in the "Project" window with a left mouse-click.
4. Using the button to the right of the path, navigate to the Microsoft Office directory.
5. Highlight the Microsoft Word executable called Winword.exe, select OK
6. Press "Apply" on the Checker Property dialog, then "OK" to save the new path.
7. From the main menu bar, select File - Main Menu to return to the menu dialog.

Procedure for importing the "Line Numbering" and "Set Margins" macros into Word:

1. Start Microsoft Word.
2. From the Word menu, select Tools, Macro, Visual Basic Editor (or Alt-F11)
3. From the Visual Basic menu, select File, Import File (or type Ctrl+M)
4. Locate the file, CrfMacro.bas, from your Checker installation directory, select "Open".
5. Select File, Save Normal from the main menu (or type Ctrl+S)
6. Exit Visual Basic, select File, "Close and Return to Microsoft Word" from the menu (or Alt+Q)

Procedure for adding line numbers to a sequence listing:

1. Load a sequence listing application file into Microsoft Word
2. Select Tools, Macro, Macros (or Alt-F8) to open the Macros dialog box.
3. Select the macro named "Line Number", then click "Run".
4. Do not save the file with line numbers in Word (Doc) format.
5. Checker will not be able to validate the file if it is saved as "*.doc" type file.
